Here are the highlights from this past month:

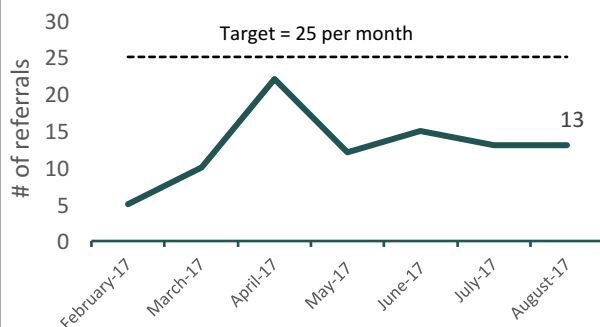
- UW staff toured all outreach clinics to assess mobile camera locations and meet staff
